- National Pool Lifeguard Qualification (NPLQ 10) Renewal.



This role combines teaching elements with rigorous evaluation of learner performance through observation, practical assessments, and portfolio review.

Key Tasks

Specific Duties will include:

- Deliver training sessions.
- Assess learner competency.
- Provide constructive feedback to learners.
- Maintain accurate training records.
- Maintain and update industry knowledge and best practices.
- Liaise with external auditors and submit all necessary records required.
- Liaise with employers and stakeholders.
- Deliver CPD sessions to pool staff as required.
